how to listen



Listening to **devo.to.go** is easy. Simply go to www.ecmsu.org/podcast.htm in your web browser, and click on the MP3 link (shown left) corresponding to the episode you want to hear.* The current week's episodes will be on the main page. Back episodes from previous weeks will be in the archive, accessible via a gray menu on the page.

If you have an iPod or use Apple's iTunes, you can also access **devo.to.go** by visiting iTunes and searching for "devo to go." A link will appear, and you can subscribe from there.
